# Charlie Zahm in Wales May 1 - May 9, 2027

---

After your overnight flight between the USA & the UK

## DAY 1: Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2027 – WELCOME TO THE UNITED KINGDOM

---

Arrive at **London Heathrow Airport**.

Meet with your English-speaking guide and driver and transfer to Cardiff via Bath.

Enjoy a lunch in a local pub or restaurant in Bath.

Visit **The Roman Baths**.

The Roman Baths in the historical city of Bath stand as one of the world's most impeccably preserved Roman ruins, allowing visitors to step back in time and wander through this expansive leisure complex much as the Romans did over 2000 years ago. Constructed in AD 70 over natural hot springs, the Great Bath continues to receive a daily flow of over one million liters of hot water from the ancient Kings Spring, dating back 12,000 years. Visitors can explore various elements of the complex, including the Sacred Spring, the Roman Temple, and the Great Bath itself. The opportunity to taste the spa water, boasting 42 minerals and purported healing powers, is available—though the flavour may not be to everyone's liking.

Continue to Cardiff and check in at your hotel. Overnight, bed and breakfast at your hotel in **Cardiff** or area. **(L)**

## DAY 2: Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2027 – Cardiff

---

This morning visit **Cardiff Castle**

Cardiff Castle stands as a prominent heritage site in Wales, boasting international significance. Stepping through its gates unveils a compelling narrative spanning 2,000 years. From the Roman era to the Norman Conquest, enduring civil unrest, a Victorian renaissance, and even the harrowing events of World War 2, these walls have borne witness to a rich tapestry of history. While Wales is renowned for its castles, Cardiff Castle sets itself apart by not only surviving the test of time but by adapting and evolving alongside the centuries in a manner that few others can rival.

Free time for an independent lunch.

Then visit **St. Fagans National Museum of History**.

The museum stands in the grounds of the magnificent St Fagans Castle and gardens, a late 16th-century manor house donated to the people of Wales by the Earl of Plymouth in 1948. Since then over forty original buildings from different historical periods have been re-erected in the 100-acre parkland, among them houses, a farm, a school, a chapel and a splendid Workmen's Institute. At St Fagans you're invited to explore the story of Wales, to shape it and share it with others.

Combined with above visits, enjoy a **panoramic tour of Cardiff**.

A tour of the Welsh capital explores a city with a long and fascinating history but also a city reinventing itself for the future. Cardiff Castle towers over the historical centre showing off an eclectic collection of architectural styles and Llandaff Cathedral marks one of the oldest Christian sites in Britain. Adjacent to the city centre Bute Park is where historical buildings, urban woodland and the River Taff combine to create the city's green heart. Down at the rejuvenated Cardiff Bay area, the old docklands and red light district has been replaced with Europe's largest waterfront development offering visitor attractions like the red-brick Norwegian Church, Doctor Who Experience and Welsh Millennium Centre cultural hub.

After dinner, enjoy tunes by Charlie Zahm.

Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in **Cardiff** or area. **(B,D)**

## DAY 3: Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2027 – CARDIFF TO ABERYSTWYTH AREA

---

This morning, depart Cardiff and journey to Aberystwyth area.

Upon arrival to St David's enjoy some free time for an independent lunch.

Then, visit **St David's Cathedral**.

Experience the timeless beauty and spiritual serenity of St Davids Cathedral in Wales. Begin your visit in the awe-inspiring Nave, then explore the intricate carvings of the Quire and the peaceful Lady Chapel. Pay homage at the Shrine of St David, a revered pilgrimage site, and take a tranquil walk through the Cloisters. Complete your journey with a leisurely stroll around the picturesque Cathedral Close. Discover history, art, and spirituality in this magnificent sacred site.

Continue to your hotel and check in. Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in **Aberystwyth (B,D)**

## DAY 4: Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> May 2027 – ABERYSTWYTH AREA TO LLANDUDNO

This morning, depart Aberystwyth and journey to Llandudno.

Drive through **Snowdonia National Park**.

Visit **Bodnant Garden**.

With intimate corners, sweeping lawns, grand terraces and verdant woodland, there are many gardens in one at Bodnant. Created over 150 years, with plants collected and brought to Britain from far afield, and the incredible vision of generations of the McLaren family and Puddle head gardeners, this haven of rarity and beauty with a stunning backdrop of the Carneddau mountains of Snowdonia is a delight for the senses. With year-round colour, the garden can be whatever you want it to be, whether that's a hive of activity or a haven of tranquillity and relaxation, this is truly a special place for all ages.

Enjoy an afternoon tea at Bodnant Wels Food, as well as some free time to visit their farm shop.

Visit **Conwy Castle**.

Conwy Castle is arguably the finest surviving example of Edward Longshank's collection of 13th and 14th century imposing castles across the north of Wales. The truly impressive size and force of Conwy Castle certainly did fulfil the monarch's mission statement of covering the locals into submission for their English king. Dominating the seaside town of Conwy, this brute of a castle is perched on a rocky outcrop and boasts eight huge towers, thick battlements and a two heavily fortified barbicans (gateways). From the interior visitors are treated to spectacular sea views and a well-preserved great hall, royal chapel and private chambers

Continue to Llandudno and check in at your hotel. Enjoy a hotel dinner followed by Charlie Zahm's private concert.

Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in **Llandudno** or area. **(B,T,D)**

## DAY 5: Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2027 – LLANDUDNO

---

Today enjoy a unique train ride in the heart of Snowdonia on one of **Ffestiniog & Welsh Highland Railways'** trains; single ride from Caernarfon or Porthmadog, standard class (subject to availability and 2027 scheduling)

Visit **Caernarfon Castle**.

A brute of a fortress. Caernarfon Castle's pumped-up appearance is unashamedly muscle-bound and intimidating. Picking a fight with this massive structure would have been a daunting prospect. By throwing his weight around in stone, King Edward I created what is surely one of the most impressive of Wales's castles. Worthy of World Heritage status no less.

Overnight, bed and breakfast at your hotel in **Llandudno** or area. **(B)**

## DAY 6: Friday 7<sup>th</sup> May 2027 – LLANDUDNO TO NEWPORT

---

This morning, depart Llandudno and journey to Newport.

Enjoy a photo stop at Pontcysyllte Aqueduct

Drive to Hay-on-Wye and enjoy free time for an independent lunch and bookshops browsing.

Continue to Newport and check in at your hotel.

Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in **Newport** or area. **(B,D)**

## DAY 7: Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> May 2027 – NEWPORT TO WINDSOR

---

Today, depart Newport and journey to Windsor.

This morning visit **Stonehenge**.

The Neolithic stone circle of Stonehenge in the Wiltshire countryside is one of the most famous wonders of the world. Dating back to approximately 3000 BC, the circle of huge upright and horizontal rectangular stones continues to fascinate academics, spiritualists and visitors. How and why did hundreds of people transport five tonne stones from all over the South of England and Wales to create a monument that has no obvious function? A multitude of theories regarding the origins and purpose of Stonehenge abound - some serious and some a little hard to believe but all have their supporters. Stonehenge could have been an elite burial mound, druid temple or ancient observatory and may have been put there by ordinary people, aliens or by Merlin the mythical wizard. This fascinating stone circle can be toured with audio guides and the modern visitor centre includes over 250 artefacts, reconstructions of Neolithic houses, and a 360-degree audio-visual presentation that all help towards understanding the structure.

Free time for an independent lunch in a café of the Stonehenge visitor centre.

Continue to Windsor and check in at your hotel. Enjoy a hotel dinner followed by your final private concert to finish up the week.

Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in **Windsor** or area. **(B,D)**

## DAY 8: Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> May 2027 – WINDSOR TO HOME

---

This morning, transfer to London Heathrow Airport for your journey home..
